



Provincial Student Associations

- •Historically have a lot of power in Quebec in fighting for student rights
- •After the collapse of the FEUQ, over 15 student associations were unaffiliated
- •Differences in opinion over voting methods and political positions resulted in two new provincial student associations, the UEQ and the AVEQ
- •SSMU has acted as an observer in the UEQ and a participant in AVEQ since May
 - •It is up to students to decide if we want to affiliate to AVEQ, UEQ, or none!





What is Austerity?

Austerity is a political program, a set of measures put in place by politicians in order to reduce a government deficit. Generally, this is some kind of combination of spending cuts and tax increases. In Canada and Quebec, billions in public spending has been slashed drastically over the last decade with increasingly disastrous effects, while tax rates on the richest institutions and individuals continue to plummet.


Community Engagement


