# University & Academic Affairs

#### **Senate**

- Allocated over 85 seats for student representation on University and Senate Committees
- Student Senators have submitted questions to Senate on the topics of physical accessibility, the refugee crisis, the truth and reconciliation report, McGill's alleged violation of Bill 100, and international tuition deregulation
- Student Senators have also been pushing for
   <u>Fall Reading Break</u> based on a proposal drafted from a McGill
   survey of approximately 4,000 undergraduates.















# University & Academic Affairs

#### **Admin Relations**

- List of SSMU's demands for upcoming Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) Negotiations were sent to the Deputy Provost Student Life & Learning. Some of the key points included:
  - Use of McGill name for student groups
  - · Permission for the SRC to cater on campus
  - Distribution of the Yearbook at more locations on campus, including convocation

In summary, the goal is to negotiate an MoA that does not unduly burden SSMU and does not unnecessarily restrict SSMU's activities.

- Attended the Joint Board-Senate Meeting on Creating a "Smart Campus" in the 21<sup>st</sup> century and bi-weekly "Future of the University" discussions
- Meetings with Principal, Provost, Deputy Provost of Student Life
   & Learning, Student Services, Enrolment Services, Associate
   Provost of Policies Procedure and Equity and various other offices
   within the administration regarding a myriad of student concerns





# University & Academic Affairs

## **Faculty VP Academics Relations**

- Re-Established the McGill Academic Round Table (MART), meetings with VP Academics from all faculty associations
- Hosted first-ever Student Academic Summit to foster stronger relations between VP Academics of departmental and faculty associations
- Presentation topics included accessibility and universal design for learning, teaching & learning services, open source textbooks, student academic rights and processes of change within the University
- Student Senators also attend their Faculty Association meetings and regularly report on activities of the University



# Policy, Research & Advocacy



### **Policy-Writing & Revisions**

- Working with the Sexual Assault Policy Working Group to consult and revise the policy to incorporate intersectionality with the goal of bringing the policy to Senate in the winter semester
  - Meeting with Associate Provost (Policies, Procedures, Equity) and the Harm Reduction Liaison Officer to examine current recourse measures and their issues
- A Subcommittee on Student Assessment was struck to research best assessment practices and will be used to revise the University Student Assessment Policy
- Advocating for greater accountability and implementation of McGill's Employment Equity Policy including resources for department chairs and setting targets

#### **Society Research Projects**

- Working on wrapping up three research projects from last year"
  - **Alternative History Timeline**: research on alternative narratives that are typically excluded in the re-telling of McGill's history
  - **Equitable Hiring**: critically examining the implementation of McGill's Employment Equity Policy and comparing practices to those of peer institutions
  - Indigenizing the Academy: investigating current efforts to support Indigenous students at McGill and compare to peer institutions as well as overall Indigenization of the academy
- Commissioned minor research projects on interdisciplinary programs, structure of other student unions and research to support SSMU during the MoA negotiations



# Policy, Research & Advocacy



## **Student Advocacy**

- Provided training to all Senators and University Committee representatives
- Will also be hosting a "Navigating McGill's Organizational Structure: Strategies for Student Advocacy" training for all students
- Working to revive the Policy Advocacy & Resource Committee (PARC)
  - PARC is an impartial resource to students wishing to create change on campus. PARC assists students in navigating University structures and in preparing research necessary to support their advocacy goals.
- Created a University Affairs Committee to increase engagement and outreach of the University Affairs portfolio

### **Future Projects**

- Know Your Rights campaign so that students are more aware of their academic rights
- Lobbying for increased use of Open Educational Resources (including open source textbooks)

- Student Services is undergoing an administrative unit review.

### Mental Health Policy & 5 Year Plan

- Organized the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Mental Health Awareness Week
  - Focus on creating educational and informative promotional materials as well as providing a diversity of programming (over 20 separate events)
- Working with VP Clubs & Services to design a feasible plan for a Mental Health Space in our building
- Meeting frequently with Mental Health Services and Healthy McGill to improve upstream services and preventative measures as well as looking at new ways to address high demands
- SSMU and Mental Health Services will be launching a "Happy Lights"
   Lending program which will allow students to rent lamps clinically-proven to treat Seasonal Effective Disorder for up to 2 weeks with a \$20 deposit from the SSMU office
- Planning a University-wide Mental Health Open Forum for next semester

- SSMU is hiring our first-ever Indigenous Affairs Coordinator to chair the Indigenous Affairs Committee, liaise with campus and community groups and spearhead a Reconciliation campaign in March
- Committee will also be drafting a policy to institutionalize advocacy and solidarity initiatives including the Traditional Territory Acknowledgment

### **Equity Complaints & Concerns**

- Improving the equity complaint procedures by promoting informal consultation with SSMU Equity and clearing communicating to a claimant when they are triggering the formalized complaint procedure
- Supported MUS and WUSC McGill in addressing equity concerns raised regarding the Froshafari theme and the "WUSC McGill Info Session" (previously titled "Mock Refugee Camp at Y-intersection")

### **Goals & Future Projects**

- Expand the diversity of equity programming to approach equity in imaginative ways using art, humour and music in addition to traditional programming such as workshops
- Increase partnerships with student groups on campus
- Work with Office for Students with Disabilities to promote accessibility and Universal Design for Learning on campus and in classrooms
- Encourage critical perspectives and increased dialogue on campus through social media and sharing of social media and articles

## **Library Relations**

- Law Library Access during exams
  - All students will have access to the Law Library during exam period during extended hours and on weekend day
- McIntyre Library renovations
- Fiat Lux "Let there be Light": The <u>Library Master Plan</u> for the Redpath and McLennan Library

### **Library Improvement Fund**

- VP University Affairs and Library Improvement Fund (LIF)
   Coordinator liaise with McGill libraries
- The LIF Coordinator oversees the distribution of \$650,000 in funds to improve library spaces for student use. Past projects include extended hours, Redpath washroom renovations, the 'fishbowl' and opening the Red Path doors (just kidding)
- Students can submit an application to the LIF Committee for consideration

## **VP Internal Delegation**

- Redesigning SSMU's website: released a <u>survey</u> to gather student feedback to guide the information that is posted on the website and how it will be reorganized
  - <u>Fun fact</u>: Most users use the website for information on clubs and services
- Old McGill Yearbook Fee: decided to postpone the fee levy to next semester in order to obtain results from the plebiscite question

#### Internal SSMU tasks

- Greatly improving the archiving and institutional memory of the University Affairs portfolio, particularly with respect to University and Senate Committees and HR processes
- Improved outreach of the University Affairs portfolio through new <u>UA Facebook Page</u> launched two weeks ago
  - 3,294 post reach this week!
- Working on finishing a work plan that will be made public and creating a SSMU University Affairs website that will include information on all parts of my portfolio
