## Motion Regarding Municipal Bylaw P-6

Submitted for: April 11, 2013

Adopted on: April 11, 2013

Whereas, on May 18, 2012, the City of Montreal modified Municipal Bylaw P-6 to require that the organizers of all assemblies, demonstrations and parades provide an itinerary and location to the Montreal police ahead of time<sup>i</sup>;

Whereas, the bylaw modification also prevents any participant in an assembly, demonstration or parade from wearing a face covering - including a scarf, mask or balaclava – without good reason;

Whereas, this bylaw modification was made in the same context as the adoption of Law 78/12 by the National Assembly, a law which was widely criticized and much of which was repealed following the election of the Parti Quebecois government in September 2012;

Whereas, in the last month, the SPVM has used P-6 as a reason to kettle and mass arrest demonstrators at 3 major demonstrations on March 15, March 22 and April 5, which total nearly 900 people detained and fined upwards of \$600<sup>ii iii iv</sup>, and which included people detained before the demonstrations even began;

Whereas, a spokesperson of the SPVM is quoted as explicitly stating that the Canadian Charter protects the right to free speech, but that "there is no right to protest"; v,vi

Whereas, the Canadian Civil Liberties Association<sup>vii</sup>, the Association des juristes progressistes <sup>viii</sup> and the municipal party Projet Montreal <sup>ix</sup> have all recently come out publicly condemning the way that P-6 is being enforced and/or are asking for it to be repealed entirely;

Whereas, this enforcement of bylaw P-6 clearly threatens the ability of any group, including students, to express its position on a particular event or issue;

Resolved, that the Students Society of McGill University (SSMU) take a position against municipal bylaw P-6 in this form, and its enforcement by way of kettles, mass arrests, and fines,

Resolved, that the SSMU communicate this position by writing an open letter to the Montreal Municipal Government and publishing it on the SSMU website,

Resolved, that the SSMU also publicize a demonstration to take place in conjunction with the Montreal City Council meeting on April 22, 2013 to encourage the abolition of P-6, and where Project Montreal will be bringing a motion for its repeal.
