- Joint Board-Senate Meeting on Mental Health: This happened last Tuesday. There was a keynote speaker, Lynn McVey, from the Douglas Institute and her "researcher." The planning committee was informed that she would be bringing a "researcher" but it turned out to be a lobbyist from Ottawa… it was really weird and really inappropriate. Ms. McVey was good, however. After the speakers, there were break-out groups; a combination of Board members, Senators and students at each table were given a vignette (story) of a student or staff member of faculty member who was undergoing mental health issues. We discussed the vignette and then targeted questions were asked of the group, such as: what does a mentally healthy community look like? How can we improve our policy at McGill? Overall, the breakout groups were awesome and came up with really good suggestions that were reported back to the group. Feedback I have heard generally: what, if any, are going to be the tangible outcomes of this committee? Why was there not an emphasis on the effects of marginalization and oppression of minority groups and the effects of this on their mental health? I have spoken with the Deputy Provost and we will be reconvening the planning committee to debrief and to look at how we can move forward and actually implement tangible changes.
- I drafted two questions for November Senate, but they were bumped to December because the Agenda was really long.
- <u>Senate yesterday</u>: The Principal addressed the football incident in her remarks, she deferred some of her time to the Deputy Provost (Ollivier Dyens) and the Dean of Students (Andre Costopolous) where they explained that a statement was to be released tomorrow (ie today). Hopefully everyone read their McGill emails and saw the

- concrete actions McGill is taking in response to this incident. I don't think that the University would have taken these steps without all of the pressure from students so good job guys!!!
- There were two questions from faculty about the new scheduling parameters, they were not really pleased with these parameters. I was on the working group that developed them over the summer so if anyone has any questions (or wants to know generally what they are) feel free to ask! Personally, I think they are necessary to help central scheduling plan out course times and help students graduate on time.
- There were two questions from Sen. Cameron Butler and Sen. Claire Stewart-Kanigan about Equity Employment practices and Equity culture at the university.
- There was an open discussion about the Quebec Charter of Values. Sen. Haley Dinel made an excellent statement condemning the Charter, along with the Dean of Religious Studies. Senate voted in favor of a motion which condemned the Charter and gave the Principal the mandate to actively lobby against it. It was agreed that anything less than outright rejection and active protest is unacceptable, considering McGills stated principles.
- The Committee on Physical Development reported to Senate. Sen. Stewart-Kanigan asked who made the decision to implement the bike gates, response; "University Services made that decision." I asked what was being done to implement principles of universal design during construction projects, response; "we implement these things when we can." Both terrible and unsatisfactory answers.
- Nominating Committee reported to Senate. There was a controversial/divisive vote regarding adding a Dean to the Senate Steering Committee. I voted against this because I felt it diluted the student voice on the committee and would shift the balance of power further in favor of upper administrators. The changes, however, passed. There was also the creation of three new committees: The Committee to Review the Enhancement of Senate Meetings, Committee to Review the Charter of Student Rights and the Committee to Review the Livestreaming of Senate Meetings.
- Key Performance Indicators, the Committee on Student Discipline, the Academic Policy Committee and the Honorary Degrees Committee also reported to Senate.
