There were 5 full status application: McGill Students' Chapter of Canadian Liver Foundation (Tabled- more info needed), McGill Chapter of War Child (Rejected 22/30), Jam for Justice (Approved 29/30 → HIGHEST SCORE FOR FULL STATUS!), Volunteers for a Smile (Rejected 22/30) and Unofficial McGill Students Guide. There were also 2 constitutional amendments.
