

CONSTITUTION

Constitution of McGill Students for Think Pink Ratified by Club's Membership on (DD/MM/YYYY): <u>08/08/2016</u> Ratified by SSMU Council on: <u>09/02/2017</u>

- 1 Article I: Name
- 1.1 McGill Students for Think Pink also referred to hereinafter as the Club.
- 2 Article II: Mandate
- 2.1 The Club's mandate shall be to
 - Promote breast cancer awareness on campus
 - Provide the McGill community with the opportunity to support the cause through enjoyable events
 - Provide involved students with a positive to get involved with the Montreal community
 - Raise funds for Quebec Breast Cancer Foundation, Breast Cancer Action Quebec, and other breast cancer-related organizations
- 2.2 Code of Conduct
- 2.2.1 The Club shall carry forth its mandate from an anti-oppressive and equitable standpoint AND equal respect shall be given to all members, including those of disadvantaged backgrounds, regardless of but not limited to gender, age, race, ethnic or national origin, religion, sexuality or sexual orientation, mental or physical abilities, language, or social class.
- 2.2.1.1 No member shall make personal profit from the club
- 2.2.2 Any executive member who fails to fulfill their responsibilities shall be subject to the expulsion procedure outlined in this constitution
- 2.3 Student Group Civility
- 2.3.1 The club will maintain cordial and respectful relations with all other clubs, services and independent student groups
- 2.3.2 The club will not use SSMU resources and/or their club status to prevent other clubs, services or independent student groups from fulfilling their mandate, including but not limited to their acquisition of resources and pursuit of activities.
- 2.3.3 If problems arise between groups, a member of the executive committee and/or collective of the club shall be responsible for contacting the SSMU Vice President of Clubs and Services and attempt to remedy the problem in a collegial fashion.
- 2.4 Environment
- 2.4.1 The club shall make attempts to regularly monitor the environmental impact of all its events and operations
- 2.4.1.1 Clubs must attempt to utilize the services and resources available at SSMU in order to maximize capacities for equitable decision-making and environmental stewardship. These include but are but are not limited the use of the plate club, green events guide, applications for the SSMU Green fund, assistance of the SSMU environment commissioners, environment committee and green events coordinators



2.4.2 The club must attempt to find sustainable alternatives to the non-recyclable #6 plastic, effective waste management, providing vegan and vegetarian options, purchasing clothing which is ethically sourced and environmentally-friendly, purchasing local and sustainable alcohol, fair trade coffee and tea, and local and/or organic foods.

3 Article III: Membership

- 3.1 Membership for a club under the Students' Society of McGill University is open to all SSMU and PGSS members, including those of disadvantaged backgrounds, regardless of but not limited to gender, age, race, ethnic or national origin, religion, sexuality or sexual orientation, mental or physical abilities, language, or social class.
- 3.2 Only Students' Society of McGill University (SSMU) and Post Graduate Students' Society (PGSS) members are eligible to be elected as officers and to hold voting privileges.
- 3.3 Associated non-voting membership is open to all others.

4 Article IV: Executive Committee

- 4.1 The Executive Committee (EC) shall administer the Club and oversee its events.
- 4.2 The EC is composed of the following five portfolios:
 - 1. Co-President
 - 2. Co-President
 - 3. Vice President External
 - 4. Vice President Internal
 - 5. Vice President Communication
 - 6. Vice President Events
- 4.3 The EC shall meet as frequently as it deems fit.
- 4.4 At least three of the six EC members must be present at an EC meeting in order for quorum to be met and for the meeting to proceed.

5 Article V: Portfolios

- 5.1 The Co-Presidents shall:
 - 5.1.1 Be the chief executive officer, chief representative, and chief spokesperson of the Club.
 - 5.1.2 Oversee all aspects of the club.
 - 5.1.3 Be the main point of contact between the SSMU VP Clubs and Services and the club
 - 5.1.4 Ensure the smooth running of the Club as a whole through facilitation of, and mediation with, the various EC portfolios with a vision that is consistent with the Club mandate.
 - 5.1.5 Chair all EC meetings.
 - 5.1.6 May cast the deciding vote in the event of a EC deadlock
 - 5.1.7 Ensure that the Club is abiding by the Constitution, By-laws and Policies of the Students' Society of McGill University
 - 5.1.8 Oversee and coordinate funding for the programming activities and events of the club
 - 5.1.9 Co-sign all financial transactions.
 - 5.1.10 Ensure the funding and financial stability of the club.



- 5.1.11 Keep track of all financial transactions and receipts in order to prepare the biyearly audits for the SSMU.
- 5.2 The Vice President External shall:
 - 5.2.1 Act as representative of the Club to the community within and outside of the University.
 - 5.2.2 Be responsible for developing healthy relations with student and community organizations within and outside McGill University, and particularly those in the Montreal area.
 - 5.2.3 Be responsible for promoting the image of the Club to the community within and outside McGill University.
 - 5.2.4 Be responsible for recruiting and communicating with sponsors.
- 5.3 The Vice President Internal shall:
 - 5.3.1 Be responsible for communication within the EC and with the Students' Society of McGill University.
 - 5.3.2 Maintain the membership list of the club.
 - 5.3.3 Oversee and coordinate the programming activities and events of the club including weekly fundraising events.
- 5.4 The Vice President Communications shall:
 - 5.4.1 Be responsible for promoting events and of the Club through listservs and social media
 - 5.4.2 Be responsible for designing and creating promotional items for events
- 5.5 The Vice President Events shall:
 - 5.5.1 Oversee implementation of monthly fundraising events and club socials
- 5.6 The Collective shall:
 - 5.6.1 Be responsible for promoting the image of the Club to the community outside McGill University.
 - 5.6.2 Act as the representative of the Club within the University community.
- 6 Article VI: Fees
- 6.1 The Club's membership fee shall be zero dollars.
- 7 Article VII: Finances
- 7.1 The Executive Committee or Collective shall examine the financial records, and prepare an audit, complete with records of all transactions and receipts, to be submitted to the SSMU at the end of each semester before May 31st of each year.
- 7.2 All club bank accounts must be kept at Scotiabank as subsections of the SSMU account
- 7.2.1 Each account must have a minimum of two and maximum of three signing officers
- 7.2.2 In order to receive funding of any kind from the SSMU, the club must have a Scotiabank account
- 8 Article VIII: Meetings



- 8.1 Regular Executive and General Meetings shall be held throughout the fall and winter terms.
- 8.2 Special Meetings shall be called at any time deemed necessary by the EC and/or Committee Chair.

9 Article IX: Electoral Procedures

- 9.1 The Executive Committee for the following year shall be decided through a two-step process. First, the current co-presidents shall interview candidates to ensure an understanding of the role and responsibilities. The co-presidents may choose three top candidates to run in a general election. Second, a general election shall be held between these candidates.
- 9.2 The Vice-President (Student Life) of SSMU or his/her representative shall be the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) with final authority over electoral procedures and validity of results.
- 9.3 The general membership must be notified of the date of the general meeting 2 weeks in advance to the date of the General Meeting called for elections purposes.
- 9.4 Elections are to be held before March 31 during the previously mentioned General Meeting.
- 9.5 The Executive Committee may designate Deputy Electoral Officers (DEOs) to assist the running of elections in consultation with the CEO.
- 9.6 Elections are to be conducted by secret ballot in person.
- 9.7 Ballots must be kept in a secure place for 5 weeks after the date of voting.
- 9.8 The Vice-President (Student Life) should be notified immediately in the event of contested electoral results.

10 Article X: Affiliations

10.1 The Club shall be affiliated with:
Quebec Breast Cancer Foundation
Breast Cancer Action Quebec

11 Article XI: Constitutional Amendment Procedure

- **11.1** Any member of the club may propose an amendment to the Constitution.
- In order to amend the constitution consensus by the Co-Presidents on the proposed amendment must be reached at a General Meeting
- 11.3 All amendments shall be submitted to the Club Commissioner, will be reviewed by the Club Committee and ratified by the SSMU council before they take effect.

12 Article XII: Bylaws and Policies

- 12.1 The club shall create and maintain bylaws that cover the operations of the club which are not specified in the Constitution.
- 12.2 The club's bylaws shall not contravene the Constitution.
- 12.3 The club by laws must be available to any member of the SSMU when and if requested.

13 Article XIII: SSMU Constitution, By-Laws and Policies

13.1 In case of any inconsistencies between the Club Constitution and the SSMU Constitution and By-Laws, the SSMU Constitution By-Laws and Policies shall take effect.
