Report of the Vice-President (University Affairs) to Legislative Council

The work in this report is a summary of all areas of the University Affairs Portfolio. All activities are the product of the hard work of many people including, but not limited to, other Executives, Senators and student staff.

University & Academic Affairs

General Updates

Fall Reading Week

The results of the survey sent out in the winter semester showed that approximately 70% of students were in favour of a Fall Reading Week after reviewing the tradeoffs. A proposal was brought forward to the Enrolment and Student Affairs Advisory Committee (ESAAC) suggesting a 5-day break in conjunction with Canadian Thanksgiving. There has been reportedly some resistance among Faculty to the idea. The proposal will be discussed again at the next ESAAC meeting this coming Tuesday (October 6th)

Enrolment Services: Inclusive Registration Forms

- Follow-up meeting regarding inclusive registration forms occurred. Changing the forms to include a non-binary gender has already been submitted to IT. A formal proposal will be submitted this year to allow students of certain identities and groups (e.g. student with dependents, students with disabilities) to self-identify. The purpose of allowing for self-identification would be to connect students to services and to collect statistics on recruitment and retention of certain populations of students.
- ➤ IT projects tend to be slow moving however in the interim we hope to change the survey McGill sends to students who accept or decline their offers of admission to include demographic questions

Library Relations

- > Met with the Libraries and the LIF Coordinator to touch base for the year
- The libraries are hosting an open forum to present the Library Master Plan on October 15th at 2:30. The Library Master Plan is a \$180 million project that would greatly increase student study space on campus and transform the Redpath/McLennan library space into more of a "student center". - Access to the law library during exams was briefly discussed with the hopes that SSMU, LSA and the Libraries will be able to arrive at a compromise and arrive at a solution amenable to the needs of all students

McGill Academic Round Table (MART)

➤ Hosted the first MART meeting of the year and agreed to meet on a monthly basis to discuss possible collaborations and updates on projects. In the meantime there will be communication via Facebook and email to stay in touch and encourage cross-Faculty collaborations and the sharing of information

Student Academic Summit

- The first-ever Student Academic Summit was hosted last weekend. The event allowed for the professional development and networking of the VP Academics of faculty and departmental associations with fellow student representations. The Summit was well-attended and received generally positive feedback from participants, however some felt that the Open Discussion was too short and rushed.

Sexual Assault Policy (SAP)

Student Advocacy

Policy Advocacy & Resource Committee (PARC)

- The purpose of PARC is to facilitate and empower students to advocate on behalf of themselves. Members of PARC are trained in the University organizational structure and assist students in navigating bureaucracy to forward their advocacy projects and create systemic change. Currently the only other resource most students have to help them navigate McGill bureaucracy is the Office of the VP University Affairs. Importantly PARC is meant to be a resource for all students wishing to create change, indiscriminate of political affiliations.

Mental Health & Well-Being

Student Services

Many changes are being proposed that would transform Student Services and have the potential to simultaneously increase efficiency and quality of service provision. A Mental Health Strategy Consultant has been hired, many of the Services have undergone internal and external reviews recently and the Student Services unit as a whole is scheduled to be reviewed in November. My job is ensuring that student needs and the student voice is the primary driver behind these changes.

- Continued meetings with multiple stakeholders regarding service provision and increasing preventative measures and "upstream services"
- ➤ Have been in discussion with Executives of PGSS, MCSS and MCGSS regarding the decision of the Deputy Provost (Student Life and Learning) to appoint a new Interim Senior Director of Student Services. We intend to release a statement on this matter voicing our disapproval with the lack of student consultation.
- Regular meetings with Mental Health Services, Health McGill and SSMU are continuing to discuss possible collaborations including the expansion of peer support services.
- The VP Clubs & Services and myself are looking into the creation of a room that can be used to facilitate group support sessions (as well as collective meetings) and the creation of a 'Mental Health Space' that would allow the Peer Support Centre to operate in our building. We are looking into room 429 and 430.
 - We are also looking into establishing an agreement with Mental Health Services to allow them to operate their Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP) group support sessions. The WRAP sessions are a new project that was funded through the Student Services Innovation Fund

Website & Social Media

- ➤ The McGill Mental Health Hub website (mcgillmentalhealthhub.ca) will be launched this weekend. It is designed to be a resource for students struggling with mental health issues and for students who wish to educate themselves on mental health.
- ➤ Will be adding a page to include information on all the events of Mental Health Awareness Week. The plan is to direct students to the website which will also be a long-lasting resource for students beyond the campaign.

Mental Health Committee

- ➤ Call-outs for the Committee are being sent out. Interested students should email mentalhealth@ssmu.mcgill.ca
 - The Outreach Working Group will focus on raising awareness for mental health and mental illness through social media, events, tabling and other creative means.
 - The Advocacy Working Group will focus on advocacy based on research and student consultation and will draft documents to propose changes to existing McGill policies and practices.

Mental Health Awareness Week

- ➤ Mental Health Awareness Week is coming up from October 15-23!
- ➤ Promotional materials are being drafted in consultation with Healthy McGill. We hope to have a series of posters that remind people of the upcoming events but also include destigmatizing and educational messaging. We are trying to create inclusive messaging that will spark dialogues on campus. We also want to adopt the #EmbraceYourMind from campaigns at UBC.
- Events are being planned with a variety of student groups on campus (Jack.org, McGill Psychology Students' Association, AUS) as well as Student Services units (Mental Health, Counselling, Office for Religious and Spiritual Life)
