Goals:

The Community Engagement Committee has three main goals for the 2015-2016 year:

- 1. Community Engagement Mixers: The Community Engagement Committee will be organizing two mixers in Winter 2016, including a Health & Human Rights mixer on January 21st and an Art & Expression Mixer on February 2nd. Right now, we are in the process of contacting different groups who might be interested in participating.
