Divest McGill

Anti-Austerity in Quebec

- The Front Commun has announced rotating strikes throughout October and November, with synchronized strikes possibly being scheduled for early December. Basically, there is huge worker mobilization happening all across Québec right now and so many opportunities for student worker solidarity
