- Will be having a discussion as to future SSMU participation in this group at council (ideally before reports) so hopefully we will have talked about this all already, but for those of you who are reading my report ahead of time (congrats, you're the best!), here are my thoughts:
  - o I'm obviously very disappointed by the referendum results, but unsurprised. It was our first attempt at a student federation affiliation campaign in over a decade, and I'm proud of the work that was put in! I think more students now know at least a little bit about how a provincial student association works
  - o I'm equally disappointed by the influence that a former UEQ coordinator managed to have on the referendum, and I hope that in the future we can avoid these local sovereignty issues
  - o Finally, I stand by our need to continue working with other student unions in the province, at least in an informal basis. We developed very good working relationships with a lot of student associations around the province through this work, and it's important to continue trying to strengthen our bonds in future years
- If the students at UQTR affiliate and then perhaps a few more affiliations next fall, I have no doubt that AVEQ will be able to establish itself as a strong player on the provincial scene, and maybe in one year after more consultation is done, we can revisit the question.
