o Further refinement by BOMCOM, see attached to BOMCOM report


• Bicycle Facility Project:

Sustainability Projects

Sustainable Frosh SPF:

Recap: Collaboration with MOOS to develop a plan to make Frosh more sustainable. Together, we submitted a major SPF application for nearly \$100 000 to target Orientation Week shirts and tote bags, the Student Handbook, and to create sustainability coordinator positions

- o Submitted additional clarifications, including details on IOC functions, our plan for ensuring institutionalization, and job description for the Sustainability Coordinator
- o A presentation is being prepared for the first IOC meeting (tomorrow)

• Sustainability at the workplace:

o Next meeting this Monday, March 27th

• SSMU Environment Committee:

o Approved \$4,000 to hire a student to coordinate volunteers and maintain the SSMU courtyard garden

SSMU Courtyard Garden Project

o Working on submitting finalized construction plan and associated details to facilities

Sustainability Advocacy

- Participated in Vision 2020 Operations Action Team #3
- Met with MOOS Director, PGSS Secretary General, MCSS President to discuss the future of the Sustainability Advisory Board. Major points:
 - o MCSS & PGSS to continue a rotating seat, discussions continue regarding the potential for a permanent PGSS seat and MCSS advising SSMU on advocacy (unlikely that a 3rd student representative seat will be added)
 - o Executive Committees will be able to delegate the individual responsible for sitting at the advisory board in September >> permanent once the individual is chosen
