

Report of the VP University Affairs to Executive Committee

February 7, 2012

Senate Caucus/Senate

- Last meeting, we had a relatively intense discussion about the presence of students dressed up like pirates during the Board of Governors meeting.
- I finished off my Senator Evaluations. Everyone was very open. I think it was a
 productive move that should be institutionalised every year. Senate Caucus this year has
 been absolutely incredible and I appreciate working with every one of them
- We have also worked on a couple questions to put forward at the next Senate meeting: One about inter-campus accessibility for Mac Campus and another about the QPIRG referenda questions.
- We will also be drafting an open letter to the McGill community in regards to recent events. We are still formulating ideas.

- Senate will be striking a committee to review whether or not it will stream Senate meetings or not.

By-Law Review Committee

 I am working with Dylan and Janina about Book 1 reform. I finished the first draft. Janina will work on revising my work but it looks like everything will be finished relatively soon.

Equity

- The last two weeks have been exceptionally equity heavy. We've had to deal with around 3 equity concerns/complaints.
- We put the finishing touches to Equity Policy and incorporated the changes recommended by our Lawyer. I am pleased with the final results!
- MCSS indicated that they may be interested in getting a similar policy in place for their campus.
- I heard news last week that our proposal for the Equity Award will likely be presented at next month's Senate meeting. I am pretty psyched about it! - I will be drafting up a formal submission in response to the Principal's Taskforce on Diversity, Excellence and Community Engagement.

Library Improvement Fund Committee

- The Library Improvement Fund Committee has met consistently more this semester and there has been a lot of movement in this portfolio. They are currently soliciting ideas for the funds from a lot of different sources, including but not limited to, the VP Academics of all the faculties and clubs such as the Medievalists.

J-Board

- At Maggie's request, I have taken this under my portfolio. It's been a steep learning curve. I do feel that council made the right decision in the end. After the Council decision to suspend the Board, I have been in talks with the J-Board, our lawyer and the exec on how to best proceed.
- This has also gobbled up a lot of my time.



Upon recommendation from the By-Law Review committee/Board of Directors, we have put forward different resolutions for reform. The process has been well planned out and I think the legal issues with the J-Board were dealt with efficiently. Great job team!

General Assembly

- The beast that is the General Assembly needs to be tamed or fed or something. Maggie has done a lot of work with outreach but the question still lingers, how do we make students feel like they have a stake in the issues and that particular form of direct governance?

Workgroup on Alternative Research Techniques

Lease

We received an offer from McGill. There has been some movement on their end. We did
meet with the Lease committee and there was a lot of contemplation and discussion. We
will discuss more in confidential session.

Consultation Fair

- Overall, I do think that the Consultation Fair was a success. The format is effective and the outreach was a lot stronger this time. We saw a lot of new faces. However, more still could be done. There was also the issue of tension between some of the upper administration with some students. Since the fair has ended, I have met with the other organisers to debrief. I think once things are contextualised in terms of long term changes, it's easier to be optimistic.
