Report of the VP University Affairs to Legislative Council

November 1, 2011

Senate

Last senate was rather intense. I do think that the student senators did a laudable job! Check out the articles in the Trib, Daily and McGill reporter. There has been significant support from students and different members of the McGill community. I think we built a lot of bridges even though the motion failed. Already different senators have started approaching us with ideas of how to move forward.

I am considering asking a couple questions/motions:

- 1. The right of students on campus/disciplinary measures and the right to freedom of expression
- 2. The consideration of having elected administrators. I will likely get Murtaza, the new Academic research commissioner to do initial research
- 3. There has been a strange trend of having more and more ex-officios become voting members of Senate. I will likely be asking a question about what precedent this sets.

Senator Appointment

We have two new Senators: Mahmoud Almasri from medicine who won by interview and Kady Paterson who won by acclamation. I am excited to work with them throughout the year.

Senator Outreach
