Interim Status clubs to be approved:

The Student Society of McGill Canadian Obesity Network Student and New Professional Chapter

Mandate:

- Helping to connect students interested in fighting misinformation and learning about the realities of the obesity epidemic across various disciplines at McGill.
- Increasing the number of future practitioners and researchers who have access to a diverse network and scientific knowledge base for the prevention and treatment of obesity.
- Advancing awareness of Canadian Obesity Network- Réseau Canadien en Obésité (CON-RCO) and its mission by holding regular events that emphasize research, treatment and education on topics surrounding obesity.

McGill Students Chapter of the Arthritis Society

- Mandate:

- Promote the public awareness and education of arthritis diseases around McGill campus and the city of Montreal;
- Provide advocacy and solutions to improve the quality of life for Canadians affected by arthritis;
- Coordinate closely with The Arthritis Society - Quebec to provide volunteering opportunities to club members to assist the various programs and services of The Arthritis Society – Quebec.

Netroots Students Society

- Provide NGOs and charities with advice regarding the creation and implementation of social media strategies;
- Enable NGOs and charities to achieve independence in their social media strategies;
- Provide opportunities for members to engage directly with NGOs and charities

Seeing Voices Montreal- SSMU

- Raise awareness for the Montréal and international deaf culture in local communities.
- Provide educational entertainment to elementary school children through theatre using American Sign Language and spoken voice.
- Give members of Seeing Voices Montréal a chance to be exposed to Deaf culture and learn American Sign Language through the medium of theatre.
- Offer the students at McGill a club environment that uses American Sign Language or Québec Sign Language (Langue des signes québécoises).
- Produce artistic pieces that diversify McGill's theatre culture using a different language that is visual.
- Set a stage for budding Voice Actors to expand their experience in Voice Acting.
- Raise money for charity and causes that are related to providing service to people who are hard-of-hearing or deaf.

McGill Student Chapter of American Association of Pharmaceutical Scientists (AAPS)

- Create an open forum where knowledge and experience will be shared between established professionals and McGill students with a common interest in the pharmaceutical sciences
- Provide current McGill undergraduates, graduate students and post-doctoral fellows with more opportunities in career development
- Discover and raise awareness about the career possibilities both in and out of academia and industry settings
- Establish a platform for networking between professionals and students
- Raise awareness in younger audiences to rectify misconceptions with regards to the pharmaceutical sciences through community outreach programs.

P.G. Wodehouse Appreciation Society

1. Introduce Members to the world of British Comedy through an exploration of popular and representative works of media and literature within this genre. We aim to do this by
 - a) Providing a fora for fans to watch, discover, and discuss forms of media representative of the genre.
