Controversial Events Town Hall: This will take place on October 8th at 5:30 PM in the Lev Bukhman Council Room (here). Please promote this widely. The Deputy Provost would like to hear from as many different groups as possible. Ultimately, we are trying to find consensus among student groups about what is permissible on campus, and how controversial events should be managed in future.


