# **Report to SSMU Council**

February 4, 2010

## Clubs, Services, and ISGs

**Choose Life** –They hosted a tabling display on Thursday, January 28<sup>th</sup>, to discuss the legal status of abortion. Conservative McGill booked the table. However even Natalie called it a "Choose Life display"– i.e. not Conservative McGill's event. I have emailed both Natalie and Conservative McGill to clarify that this sidestepping is against the rules and not permitted. I have also informed McGill events bookings of the infraction for their information. No further action will be taken from my end.

**Mature and Re-Entry Students Association (MRSA)** – After repeated discussions with the Associate Dean of Arts, MRSA was forced to move out of their lounge to make way for a new imaging laboratory. We will be storing their furniture – they will likely have an office come June.

**Club insurance –** We are embarking on the journey of getting our clubs insurance. Wish us luck.

## **Publications**

**Old McGill** – We are allowed to table at Roddick Gates during Convocation, so get excited! Sales are already now at what they were total for last year, so we will definitely sell more books than last year. In terms of production, layouts are being done. We are still gathering event photos.

**Tribune** – I have been working a lot on this. This is roughly the timeline we are looking at:

- February 1 The SSMU presents the suggested Lease Agreement and contract for use of the Communications and Publications Manager.
  February 4 Deadline for Council-initiated referendum questions to be approved at Council The Tribune submits revisions of the Lease and CPM contract to the SSMU.
  February 12 Deadline for student-initiated referendum question to be submitted to the CEO The final version of the Lease Agreement and CPM contract is reviewed and agreed on by both parties.
- March 2 11 The Tribune campaigns for independence.
- March 12 Results announced. The question passes.
- March 13 Tribune applies to become incorporated. The lawyer will be paid by the SSMU. Expected cost: \$1,500. Expected turn-around time: 3 weeks.
- April 5 Incorporation should be finalized. \*At this point, the Tribune will be independent from the SSMU\*

We have prepared a lease and CPM usage contract that the Tribune is reviewing. We are also going to finalize their budget this week since this will determine the fee amount they will go for. It is difficult to predict advertising revenues from year to year, especially giving the continued decline. Lastly I am doing some cash flow projections. The Tribune will have \$0.00 dollars as of June 1, so it's very important to predict their summer expenses and revenues and figure out how much money they will need to maintain a healthy cash flow.
