Interim Status Applications:

McGill Students Chapter of End Poverty Now

The Club's mandate shall be to:

- Educate the public and raise awareness about issues related to global and local poverty.
 Create discussion platforms on issues of poverty in different areas around the globe.
- Hold fundraising events to contribute to the organization's grassroots, sustainable, and community-led development and redistributive projects
- Provide local volunteer opportunities for students to help alleviate poverty at the community level through reaching out to community organizations
- Involve all members in EPN grassroots projects and local volunteering opportunities to fight poverty together

Committee Recommendation: Reject

The Committee recommends the rejection of McGill Students Chapter of End Poverty Now due to their score of 18/30 on the Interim Status Approval Rubric and their mandate overlap with existing SSMU Clubs focusing on poverty alleviation.

McGill Students Naginata Club:

The Club's mandate shall be to:

- Hold regular practices of the Japanese martial art "Naginata."
- The club will encourage active participation by holding events such as gradings (skill exams), tournaments, and seminars (extended practices) as well as informal social events.
- The Club shall be mandated to provide opportunities for physical training as well as to create a forum for discussion of the philosophy of budo and Japanese martial arts and sports culture.
- The Club shall be mandated to pursue correct Naginata as taught by trained instructors.

McGill Students' for Room to Read


The Club's mandate shall be to:

McGill Students Travel Magazine


The Club's mandate shall be to:



- Recruit volunteers for the C.A.R.E. center. Students will have the opportunity to volunteer under the supervision of staff members.
- Enhance the quality of life of clients at C.A.R.E. through increasing social inclusion.
- Provide an opportunity for McGill students to gain a unique perspective, learn about disability, communication aids, and interaction.
- Organize outings where C.A.R.E. clients get to explore Montreal. Volunteers are needed for one-on-one support and pushing wheelchairs)
- A side project called "one wish at a time" asks one C.A.R.E. member every month what is one thing they want to do or one place they would like to go. Through fundraising initiatives and the help of our volunteers, our club aims to empower C.A.R.E. clients to achieve their own goal.
- Provide means of social inclusion of C.A.R.E members at McGill (student organizations, events, talks/lectures). Potentially, this would include regular visits from certain interested C.A.R.E members to McGill events allowing clients to explore a new community and grow in social skills.
