Anti-Austerity

Climate Justice

- Organized a bus to Ottawa for the Climate Welcome with Divest McGill! It was SO AMAZING. Generally a really great community of climate justice organizers across the country! One negative: Justin Trudeau did not accept our solar panels.
- The executives and I will be sending a letter to Suzanne Fortier asking her to make a statement on climate change before the COP negotiations in Paris next month.

Divest McGill

• Two main focuses as of right now: our alumni outreach campaign and developing our relationship with the administration. CAMSR will be voting on fossil fuel divestment soon (I hope!), and it is so essential that they don't write us off as a bunch of powerless student activists. If you want to help, you can send emails to individual members of CAMSR outlining your desire to see McGill divest! (See me for details!)

Demilitarize McGill

• They hosted some really cool events this week! On November 18th, they are hosting another event on indigenous resistance to colonialism - should be super interesting.

• Working on a history of student activism at McGill project which will solicit memoirs of past student activists at McGill. This will be published on website alongside consolidated information of resources for student activists, such as all of the resources SSMU can provide for campaigns!

Mobilization

Anti-Austerity in Quebec

• November 5th demonstration was the first major student-organized demonstration on the fall, and the turnout wasn't as high as it could have been (~2500 people), despite over 50,000 students on strike for the day. McGill Against Austerity will be going to an event this Wednesday to learn more about the role students can play in this massive mobilization which is largely lead by workers at the moment

• Culture Shock happened! It was really amazing, and a lot of work went into it by the popular education committee of QPIRG. We are super excited to start planning for Social Justice Days! Will be hiring a coordinator very soon.
