## **AVEQ**

- Last congress February 21st-22nd at UQTR
- Discussed membership and affiliations
  - At least three organizations will be running questions this semester (AGE UQTR, AGEUQAR, and SSMU)
    - If all vote yes, AVEQ would have nearly 80,000 members
  - o Some organizations still might run a question either this semester or next (PGSS, GSA, MCSS)
    - If all vote yes, AVEQ would have nearly 95,000 members
  - Some organizations will likely run a question next fall (MAGE UQAC, ADEESE, AELIES, AEETS)
    - If all vote yes, AVEQ would have nearly 125,000 members
- Voted on positions that were consensual for the group in order to create a "positions book" and clarify the associations stance to various socio-political issues
  - Tuition fees and student conditions
    - Tuition and FIO's
    - Financial aid
    - International and out-of-province students
    - Unpaid internships
    - Family studies balance
    - Research
    - Austerity and the funding of education
  - Environment and sustainability

### International students

- Recent reports have indicated that the provincial government may make more cuts to university funding, but that universities will be allowed to make up the difference by charging international students an additional 25% (around \$3000-\$4000 per year for international students)
- Spoke to Olivier Marcil (VP External of McGill) who has stated that nothing is confirmed yet. I asked him to release a public statement indicating that McGill will not raise international tuition, even if allowed by the government, similar to what the University of Quebec at Chicoutimi did, but so far no action has been taken.
