BUILDING AFFAIRS

- 4 Rouge Media adds are now up across the building – 2 downstairs, 1 on the main floor, one by the SRC. Adds were pre-approved by Ryan and Myself to make sure they didn't conflict with our operations
- Buildings & Operations Management Committee was held on Tuesday (September 13th). We compiled a number of potential building improvement projects that could be funded out of Space fee

FOOD & BEVERAGE

- B-Week is this week; last night (Monday) was a huge success with over \$2000 in sales
- Coyote Ugly this Thursday however interest has not been as high as expected on the Facebook Campaign
 - Coyote Ugly is an important event for us: we have a Jack Daniels sponsorship for the event and we need a good turnout to keep getting free product



Student-Run Café (SRC)

- SRC had its biggest day of sales ever last Thursday – over 300 sales! (316)
 - Keep in mind; this was with 2000 people moving through the building and after staying open for an additional 3 hours
- Overall, sales have been strong in the first two weeks (averaging at 250 sales a day) and although it's too early to tell, it seems that we're doing significantly better than we were at this time last year – more concrete numbers to come soon
- We've reorganized the 2nd floor cafeteria; this should encourage more people to sit near the SRC (and as a result to buy more food)

Indigenous Art Project


- Has been on hold for the past two weeks, but will start reaching out to Paige from FPS to recruit students for the project
