## **Interim Status Applications:**

#### McGill Improvisational Longform Students' Association

The Club's mandate shall be to:

- Provide a community allowing deconstructive appreciation for longform improvisational theatre as an emerging art form.
- Expose members to a wide range of challenging professional longform improvisation formats such as the Harold, the Armando, and La Ronde.
- Promote collaborative creativity in members' scene-work through the teaching of contemporary longform improvisational techniques as outlined in leading improvisational theatre theory books such as UCB's Comedy Improvisation Manual.
- Foster high-caliber skills in the art of longform improvisational theatre in members.
- Hold events serving as performance opportunities for members.

Recommendation: The Club Committee recommends the rejection of the McGill Improvisational

Longform Students' Association due to their score of 19/30 on the Interim Club Status Approval Rubric. The Committee recommends that the club approach McGill Students' Improv to incorporate longform improvisation

into the activities of the existing club.

## Neurodiverse Space

The Club's mandate shall be to:

- Help students across spectrums of mental competence advocate for themselves in terms of self-determination and accessibility in academic life, peer support, and public acceptance and knowledge;
- Provide opportunities for all students to educate themselves on neurodivergent experiences and emphasize application of the Neurodiversity paradigm (all human brains are natural and valuable) in consideration of daily institutions;
- Improve accommodations and accessibility of student services by collaborating with existing McGill services and programs;
- Hold events and activities which will increase awareness and acceptance of positive and/or prideful disability experiences, or recommend existing resources and services like therapies or wellness initiatives which do not compromise student safety or identity;

- raise money in order to help accomplish the goals of ALS Canada's foundation.

Recommendation: The Club Committee recommends the rejection of McGill Students for ALS

due to their score of 17/24 on the Interim Status Approval Rubric.

Veterans due to their score of 23/30 on the Interim Status Approval Rubric.

#### McGill United States Student Association

The Club's mandate shall be to:

- Raise awareness of traditional and modern American cultural and historical legacies, while emphasizing the role of multiculturalism in the United States. Raise funds and raise awareness for charities in the United States that support the well-being and social integrity of the country e.g. the continuing rebuilding efforts in New Orleans, and the social and economic disenfranchisement of minority groups in urban areas of the US.
- Act as an inclusive, non-partisan venue for discussions regarding such things as current issues in the society and culture of the United States, as well as its history.
- Aid students in finding opportunities to work or intern at American companies, global companies based in the US, or in the US federal and state government.
- Provide students with chances for socialization and involvement, through volunteering opportunities and social events, from which friendships and community cohesiveness are built.
- Act as a networking venue for past, future, and present US students and Non-US students who are interested in the culture and history of the United States.
- Collaborate with other cultural clubs in order to work towards promoting common interests in fundraising and cultural exchange.
