

Motion or Resolution for Approval	Be it resolved that the Legislative Council approve the following question for the Winter 2020 referendum period: Do you agree to the renewal of the non-opt-outable Access McGill Fee of \$2.00 per student per semester (excluding summer), payable by all undergraduate students who are members of the SSMU, starting in Fall 2021 and ending Winter 2026 (inclusive) at which time it will be brought back to the membership for renewal, with the understanding that a majority "no" vote will result in the discontinuation of funding used to provide services and resources necessary to improve accessibility within the University? Be it further resolved that the SSMU Legislative Council adopts the actionable aspects of this question and that any grammatical or legal changes necessary do not need the re-approval of the Legislative Council.
