Issue	organization is in need sweaters, gloves, mitt	Resilience Montreal has made an urgent call for winter clothing. The organization is in need of winter jackets, boots, snow pants, sweatpants and sweaters, gloves, mittens, and tuques. Many community members spend nights outside, and with winter coming they are in need of warm clothing.		
Background Rationale	Resilience Montreal is a community-led project that supports many Indigenous people in the Cabot square area. With \$4,000 dollars from the Indigenous Equity Fund will be able to provide approximately 30 jackets, 18 pairs of winter boots, and 40 pairs of mittens, which will be helpful to many Indigenous people in the area.

## Consultations Completed

In the last Indigenous student consultation, the majority of participants felt that there should be more outreach to community services such as Resilience Montreal. Consultations have been done with the Vice-President External and the Executive Committee. Efforts have been led by the Indigenous Affairs Commissioner.

## Risk Factors and Resource Implications

One potential risk factor is that it is a sizable expense. It will cost \$4,000 and will require communication with an external organization.

## Sustainability Considerations

This motion is socially sustainable because it actively seeks to help out Indigenous people living in the Cabot Square area. Jackets will be purchased from local surplus and liquidation stores.

# Impact Decision and Next Steps

If the motion is passed, the Indigenous Affairs Commissioner, with the support of the Indigenous Affairs Committee, will be mandated to make a winter clothing donation of up to \$4,000 to Resilience Montreal. They will reach out to Resilience Montreal to figure out the logistics in terms of purchasing and providing this donation.
