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> Whereas, the ECOLE Project has gained status as an Independent Student Group (ISG) with the Students' Society of McGill University (SSMU);

Whereas, the ECOLE Project provides a free space booking service that includes the dining room, study room, living room and kitchen. These rooms have been used by several dozen McGill groups since the Winter 2018 referendum;

Whereas, since its launch in the Fall of 2014, ECOLE has provided the McGill community with over 290 events related to alternative education programming. These events are geared to engage in topics related to sustainability and justice, including film screenings, Zero Waste Challenges, potlucks, career discussions, used bookstore crawls, vegan cooking workshops, game nights, meditation & mindfulness circles, organized discussions, formal skill-sharing events, and much more;

Whereas, members of the ECOLE Project pursue yearlong microprojects centred around sustainability topics, with the aim to develop tools and resources to support students pursuing similar projects or initiatives and showcase their projects at annual Symposiums;

Whereas, since the launch of the ECOLE project in Fall 2014, 35+ hands-on community-based projects have been completed by ECOLE members;

Whereas, the ECOLE Project had fewer hired facilitators and was unable to host any physical events during 2020 and 2021 due to COVID-19 measures; thereafter, it had a reduced engagement and presence on campus, which it is working hard to change;

Alignment with Mission

This motion is in line with SSMU's constitutional responsibility of leadership in matters of social justice and environmental protection as well as the SSMU's Climate Justice Policy and the SSMU's Sustainability Policy and positions.

Whereas, ECOLE provides the McGill community with several services and activities (such as those mentioned above) that strengthen the environmental and educational experiences and conditions for SSMU's members.

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	Whereas, ECOLE attempts to further sustainability in its entirety (not jus ecological) as stated in the SSMU values "The SSMU recognizes the holis nature of sustainability and the importance of addressing environmenta social, and economic viability."	
Consultations Completed	Whereas, the VP (External Affairs) and the VP (Finance) have been consu about the motion via email and no issues were raised. VP Finance Marco asked that we provide our budget which can be found on appendix A.

Risk Factors and Resource Implications	If the Legislative Council was to approve the question for the Winter 20 Referendum period, this would result in Election SSMU adding this question on the ballot and supporting a possible future YES and NO campaign as per the SSMU Internal Regulations of Elections and Refere	
	If the Legislative Council was to vote against the approval of the question this would automatically result in the end of the ECOLE Project as soon the end of the 2023 Winter semester without giving students a chance t weigh in on the decision.	



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Sustainability Considerations

Whereas, working to attain social and material sustainability is a key challenge of the 21st century and a priority to the University, as indicated in its Climate & Sustainability Strategy 2020-2025 [2]

Whereas, it is stated in the introduction of SSMUs Sustainability Policy that "Students operate a large number of important services for students and are leading movements to improve sustainability at McGill, including the work and advocacy done by groups such as Divest McGill, ECOLE, ..."[3]

Whereas, the ECOLE Project promotes community building by filling the need for a central space on campus where students, faculty and staff members can gather, connect and organize around sustainability;

Whereas, ECOLE has become a symbol of sustainable living, conviviality, and various degrowth principles on campus.

Whereas, ECOLE exists to support and further all aspects of sustainability.

Impact of Decision and Next Steps The approval of the question would result in its addition to the winter 2023 referendum ballot and give the students the chance to vote on the issue.

Whereas, a 'yes' vote to the following question would ensure the financial sustainability of the ECOLE Project as it fulfills its mandate of providing meeting space, sustainable educational learning opportunities, support for student research, and a greater sense of community to McGill students;

Whereas, a 'no' vote to the following question would entail that the ECOLE project will cease to exist after the end of the Winter 2023 semester;



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Motion or Resolution for Approval

Be it Resolved that, the SSMU Legislative Council approve the following question for the Winter 2023 Referendum period:

"Do you support the renewal of the opt-outable student levy, titled "ECOLE Project Fee," of \$2.00 per student per semester, payable by all part-time and full-time undergraduate students who are members of the SSMU, starting Fall 2023 and ending Winter 2028 (inclusive), at which point it will be brought back to the membership for renewal, with the understanding that a majority vote "no" will result in the discontinuity of the operations of ECOLE due to lack of funding?"

Be it further resolved, that the SSMU Legislative Council adopts the actionable aspects of this question and that any grammatical or legal changes necessary do not need the re-approval of the Legislative Council.

Be it resolved that, the Legislative Council approves, and recommends the ratification to the Board of Directors, for the motion to appear on the ballot.
