Consultations Completed	The Community Affairs Commissioner, who chairs the MPRWG [Milton-Parc Relations Working Group], was consulted on this motion. The renewal of the mandate of this working group is central to the Community Affairs portfolio.
Risk Factors and Resource Implications	There are no financial risk factors associated with this motion. The failure of this motion could cause harm to the relationship between the Society and the community organizations working in Milton-Parc, worsening, amongst other factors, the public image of the Society.
Sustainability Considerations	Community-oriented projects can be linked to the Society's commitment to sustainability, however they need not be drawn out in detail for the scope of this motion.
Impact of Decision and Next Steps	Should this motion pass, the Milton-Parc Relations Working Group shall remain in effect for three (3) years before needing to be renewed by the Legislative Council. In the meantime, it will be business as usual. The terms of reference shall be updated to match those appended. The committee will continue to meet throughout the spring and recruit new members in Fall 2024. Finally, the Community Affairs Commissioner will continue to report on the progress of the working group to the Legislative Council on an annual basis.
Motion or Resolution for Approval	Be it resolved that the Legislative Council renew the mandate of the Milton-Parc Relations Working Group for 3 years, until May 1, 2027. Be it further resolved that the Legislative Council approve the changes to the Milton-Parc Relations Working Group as shown in Appendix A. Be it further resolved, that the Board of Directors vote on the ratification of this working group renewal at their next regular meeting.

3.1. Oversight

The Milton-Parc Action Relations Working Group will be a working group of the Legislative Council until May 2027.

3.2. General

The Milton-Parc Relations Working Group aims to build and maintain community relationships with ongoing participatory discussion in order to build off of the commitments made in the CARE agreement between McGill, SSMU and the Milton-Parc Citizens' Committee, with a new focus on projects that emphasize decolonization and solidarity with unhoused people in Milton-Parc

3.3. Mandate

- Review and revise the current SSMU and Milton-Parc relationship;
 - Milton-Parc is defined as the area enclosed by the streets University, St-Laurent & Sherbrooke and des Pins.
- Work on the creation of the **Milton-Parc Action Plan**, a plan designed to mandate each party to take action in order to better neighborhood relations.

3.4. Membership

The Milton Parc Relations Working Group will consist of the following membership:

- Community Affairs Commissioner;
- VP (External Affairs);
- McGill Dean of Students;
- Representative from the Milton Parc Citizens' Committee (MPCC);
- Representative from Comm-Un (or a representative of the Miton-Parc unhoused community);
- 1-5 representatives of other community organizations in Milton-Parc (e.g., Bar Milton-Parc, Association récréative Milton-Parc, Communauté Milton Parc, Mobilizing for Milton-Parc, QPIRG-McGill)
- 1 to 3 general members from the student body;
- 1 to 3 general Milton-Parc citizens;
- 1 to 3 members of McGill faculty or staff.
