Issue		The opt-outable SSMU Community Engagement Fund Fee, also referred to as the Charity Fund Fee, will expire in Winter of 2025 and therefore requires renewal.		
Background and Rationale		The Community Engagement Fund provides monetary support for student-led charitable initiatives and events that promote community engagement. This fund is allocated by the funding committee, and has seen steady demand throughout the past few years. In 2023-2024, more than 12% of funding applications were directed to the community engagement fund, despite this being the smallest of the fees disbursed by the funding committee. The Community Engagement is scheduled to expire in Winter of 2025 and therefore requires renewal in order to continue supporting community engagement initiatives.
