## Updates:

For the Mohawk mothers, we decided to include blurbs within the SSMU listserv with relative information. When the updates are large enough, we will send them out in their own newsletter. This is to better inform the student population in a more digestible manner such that we provide resources and smaller updates, keeping it on their radar. We also agreed to help pay for their hotel cost for their trip to Ottawa to fight in the Senate.

For the art show, we have decided to book a drag queen and a host. We have also secured an artist who will paint a mural within the SSMU building. The wall has already been decided and we are working on starting the process of painting and securing a contract with the artist. We have booked the ballroom for this event which will take place on friday February 7th 2025, 1-8 tentatively. It will

W have decided to focus our efforts on the mural and the show with the display being in the back of our minds.

As for the James McGill plaque, we have decided to put the endeavour on hold and focus mainly on the art show.

For other equity funds, we have approved a couple via email, including an equity fund request for laptop repairs and for conference travel costs.

I think the way we have been progressing is quite well and I have no large changes to make a note of. Meeting once a month has been working out well as we just do email correspondence when things become urgent.
