VP Academic:

- EUSF has received a good number of applications
- Reworking some of our funding bylaws
- Releasing academic complaint forms for SAA and non-departmental courses
- TechFair was a success, McDoe (TechFair but for startups) was postponed but is going well
- MESC is trying to help us figure out room bookings and making it less terrible
- EPTS is going well (as usual)
- Killed a committee (have yet to do it officially)

VP Finance:

- Fall budget review was very comprehensive
- Cancelled our garda contract after 1+ years of horrible service
- Currently doing funding committees for space fund, design team fund, and clubs fund

VP Services:

- OAP
 - 8 day event, all time high revenue
 - Improved storage solutions thanks to space resources from SSMU
- Maintained student access/rentals to
 - Lockers, with new information system
 - EUS Room bookings
 - Access to EUS Spaces
- Improved credit card transaction security across all services (Frostbite, Copi-EUS, GStore and OAP) with private data for square transactions
- Provided support, payroll, and HR to Frostbite, Copi and GStore

VP Communications:

- EUS Website
 - Started working with our IT Committee to update it
 - Goal is to add more information about the EUS, how we run, the Executives, and our clubs & design teams
- Currently working on going through the emails in our domain and getting rid of unnecessary or outdated users

- Created the EUS Student Handbook over the summer to provide first years and upper years with information on the EUS, involvement, and resources within engineering and beyond

VP Events:

- Ran MERTW on October 9th with 400 participants from both EUS and other faculties
- Ran EUS Conference in a limited capacity due to significant cost hikes in room booking
- Most committees in the portfolio are running well, however there is a vacancy for chairs in one
 - The independent committees under events are PNU, EUS Sports, ESC, EAC, Grad Comm, and Ski Trip

VP Student Life:

- Ran a clubs purpose audit with a disappointing turn out leading to a significant number of clubs being put on probationary status
- Paid for students to work as interns on projects with DTs over the summer through the DT internship program
- Organised involvement day to showcase our clubs and DTs to the student body
- Organised a retreat for our council with 60 people attending for the two days

VP External:

- Reviewed and updated most of the external policies and still working on the rest
- For the first time in a while the external portfolio has all director positions filled. (External Relations and corporate relations)
- Attended SDES (a meeting for all VPX and pres of all eng schools in canada) in PEI
- SDES was very informative and brought back some valuable insights on how other schools operate.
- CDE is being hosted at McGill. (you should already know this by now)

VP Internal:

- Frosh was successful, generating a profit reinvested into the First-Year Initiative Fund.
- E-Week (Jan 7–11) is in planning.
- Junior Council has hosted successful events with more upcoming.
- Blues' capacity issues are resolved and operations are smooth.
- Cross-department collaboration is strong, with a successful crawl completed and a fall banquet in planning.

President:

- Hired a full new equity co-commissioner team!
- Fall referendum went smoothly!
- Revamped our student space fund into a fully-fledged capital projects fund, allowing more flexibility for the EUS to execute large projects without any increase in fees paid by students.
- Removed our IRP policy, while staying signed onto the SSMU one while we make improvements to our processes
- Working with the faculty to allow our design teams to rent McGill vehicles for going to competition
- Leading the launch of a new student-led teaching award with our faculty, funded by a donor.
- Worked with VP Events to secure funding from Athletics & Recreation and SSMU to continue running the Iron Rink (outdoor rink on lower field), now as a joint venture.
