VP Academic:

- Our peer tutoring service room got some new furniture and new paint!
- TechFair went well in the fall, coming up very soon for the winter edition
- Our equipment funding cycle has begun, so hopefully we'll be getting a lot of new equipment for our labs and whatnot

VP Finance:

- Looking for an Auditor! Please let me know which firms you guys use and if they are affordable.
- Working with Brink's now for secure deposits, they are absolutely lovely to work with and miles above garda.
- Transitioned our entire finance database onto a new system, since the old computer had drive errors and I feared it would break down.
 - Managed to avoid paying \$600 by using the legacy version of printboss, it still works but you just need to finagle with the installation
- Currently working on clarifying finances between certain departmental societies and clubs that have acted inconsistently through the years.

VP Services:

- G-Store implemented a new optimized layout using the EUS Caps Fund
- Copi-EUS switched from Xerox to Ricoh printers
- OAP new storage initiatives with SSMU, and new EUS storage container, saving thousands in what we usually spend on storage
- All services are doing well and producing revenue

VP Communications:

- EUS Website & Wiki
 - Our website got a new look, it was restyled by one of our board members working on restoring the wiki
 - The wiki and the website have been revamped and are continuing to be updated
- Yearbook
 - Hired an editor to help with its creation and currently trying to get a committee together

VP Events:

- MERTW was successful in fall and have started hiring for winter, it looks like it will go well.
- Grad Comm ran fall iron ring and reception, working on winter but looks like there will be a deficit due to price hikes
- VB might be in the SSMU Ballroom to reduce costs, otherwise going well

- Committees are running well, ESC may be coming back. EAC is still dead
- Iron Rink was set up (thank you for your contribution SSMU) and running less of a deficit due to partnership with Athletics and SSMU

VP Student Life:

- Winter Involvement day was successful with good turnout
- Design teams are continuing to function well with preparations for competitions in the winter and summer
- Getting new interest from groups to become clubs so in talks with them
- Council continues to work well with good attendance and

VP External:

- Got Global Engineers an exception for them to participate in EngGames and QEC until their program gets accredited by the CEAB. (Criteria to be able to participate)
- Conferences have been very productive. The CFES (Canadian Federation of Engineering Societies) worked on their finances. And presented a very well made action plan from all the feedback they got from schools.
- CDE Conference on Diversity in Engineering was a GREAT SUCCESS.

VP Internal:
