Dear Candidate,

First off, good for you for deciding to run in the **Fall 2026 FYC elections**! It's a tough decision to make, but getting involved with student politics so early in your McGill career is extremely rewarding, so kudos to you! The Elections SSMU team is here to guide you through the campaigning and polling periods, so please don't be afraid to take advantage of us!

There are five positions up for FYC elections:

- President
- Vice President (Student Affairs)
- Vice President (Finance)
- Vice President (Internal Affairs)
- Vice President (External)

For a description of these positions, please refer to the First-Year Council Constitution, the Internal Regulations of Governance, or contact the Vice-President (Internal) at internal@ssmu.ca.

Please fill out all of the attached documents in this package and read the documents here stipulated, to complete your candidacy, by following all of the following steps:

1. Make sure you are eligible to run. To run, you must:

- a. Be an SSMU member. All students registered at McGill University shall be Members, except for the following (SSMU Constitution 5.1):
 - i. students registered in the Faculty of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences;
 - ii. students registered at the Centre for Continuing Education;
 - iii. students registered in graduate programs; and
 - iv. students who are also full-time members of the teaching staff.
 - b. Be an undergraduate student in their U0 or U1 year who is attending McGill for the first time in good academic standing at McGill are eligible to run.
2. Where required, fill out your personal information, print your name as you want it to appear on the ballot, and sign the attestation of academic standing.
 3. Email us an electronic copy of your 150-word pensketch (Optional). There are more details on page 4.
 4. Collect at least 25 signatures from first-year undergraduate students who wish to support your candidacy by asking them to fill out the enclosed nomination form. (**Note: you might want to include extra signatures to ensure all of the required ones are valid*). You may also collect signatures via a

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Google Form issued by Elections SSMU. If you wish to collect signatures in that way, please submit your nomination kit (without the signature page filled in) first. An Elections SSMU Officer will inform you once your nomination kit is received, and provide you with a Google Forms link to collect signatures.

5. Please submit this kit **with your proof of enrollment** by **11:59 PM** on **September 4th, 2026**. This kit should be submitted electronically to elections@ssmu.ca. **Please note that the signature collection is also due at the end of the nomination period.**
Late forms will be rejected without appeal.
6. Attend the mandatory candidates' meeting on **Wednesday, September 16, 2026, from 6:00 pm - 7:30 pm** in the Boardroom of 3501 Peel Building. Please contact Elections SSMU ASAP if you cannot make it to this meeting due to an unavoidable conflict (for e.g. an exam). Those who do not attend this meeting without notice will be sanctioned. At this meeting, you will get a chance to meet the Elections SSMU Officers and find out how the election works. More importantly, we will explain the Elections By-Laws, as well as the rules, procedures and possible sanctions that are applicable.
7. Elections SSMU requires that all candidates carry themselves in full respect of the Constitution and Governing Documents of the SSMU. The officers of Elections SSMU are specially charged to maintain good electoral decorum and enforce campaign violation regulations. Important dates to remember

- **Nomination Period:** Monday, August 31 to Monday, September 14 at 11:59 p.m.
- **Information Session (Optional):** Wednesday, September 2, Boardroom, 3501 Peel, 6:00-7:30 p.m.
- **Extended Nomination Period** (only for positions with one or less candidates):
Tuesday, September 15 to Wednesday, September 16, 5:00 p.m.
- **Mandatory Candidates Meeting:** Wednesday, September 16, Boardroom, 3501 Peel, 6:00-7:30. p.m.
- **Campaign Period:** Thursday, September 17 at 12:00 a.m. to Sunday, September 20 at 11:59 p.m.
- **Polling Period:** Monday, September 21 at 9:00 a.m. to Friday, October 2 at 9:00 p.m.
 - Campaigning may take place during the Campaign and Polling periods. Please be aware that prospective candidates may not begin campaigning until the campaign period begins.
Violation of this rule will result in disqualification.
- **Announcement of results:** as soon as results are verified on October 2

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Time Commitment

As this is an executive position, weekly meetings are a necessity on top of some emergency meetings that may happen throughout the year. Since the first year council's objective is to represent and advocate for the needs and interests of all undergraduate first-year students, in residence and off-campus, hosting events throughout the year is a must. During the days and weeks before and after events, time commitment will increase as well. You can expect this position to be around 5-10 hours of work per week with fluctuations depending on the time of year. I'd advise you to consider if this time commitment works for you before running for these positions :)

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Pensketch & Pictures (Optional)

All candidates have the right to pen a brief outline about themselves, their qualifications and the ideas that they will bring to the position being sought. This information will be uploaded onto the Elections SSMU website and Online Voting System.

Written Pensketech

If you would like your pensketech to appear in French, it is your responsibility to have it translated. The deadline is the same for the French version of your pensketech. Elections SSMU highly suggests that you do this, because if you only submit an English pensketech, it will not appear on the ballot when students choose to vote in French.

- **ENGLISH** TEXT MAY NOT EXCEED 150 WORDS IN LENGTH: EXCESS WORDS WILL BE CUT.
- **FRENCH** TEXT MAY NOT EXCEED 175 WORDS IN LENGTH: EXCESS WORDS WILL BE CUT

Video Pensketech

In addition to the written pensketech, you may submit a video, maximum of 60 seconds about your platform. The video will be accessible on the ballot. You may choose to have a separate video for English and French, a video in both English and French, or a video of only English or French. Please note if you do not have a French video, it will not appear on the ballot when students choose to vote in French.

Shortened Pensketech

For a chance to be featured on the SSMU Instagram and other social media platforms, you may submit a shortened pensketech.

- **ENGLISH** TEXT MAY NOT EXCEED 50 WORDS IN LENGTH: EXCESS WORDS WILL BE CUT.
- **FRENCH** TEXT MAY NOT EXCEED 60 WORDS IN LENGTH: EXCESS WORDS WILL BE CUT.

- ☐ Collect signatures! Ensure you have at least 25 signatures and from only first year undergraduate students (U0/U1 students who are new to McGill)
- ☐ Once you are done collecting signatures, submit the final list to Elections SSMU for verification. We will check if everyone is an eligible student and if there are any duplicates within your list.
